

## Self-Directed Learners

- Manage their own learning by:
- Making smart choices about the use of their time.
- Giving input on their choices of subject matter for inquiry.
- Generating criteria for assessments—such as student generated rubrics.
- Self-directing learning and self-management skills (e.g. know what strategies to use for learning different topics and applying them in a way that makes the most effective use of their strengths.)
- Effectively using available resources.
- Recognizing when to reach out to peers and outside resources for collaboration.
